Gone West Hugh Jones 1925-2012 by Norm Isler

Friday evening, I had a call from Art Thieme informing me that long time EAA 44 member Hugh Jones passed away earlier in the day. Although we have not seen Hugh much in recent years, Hugh was a key member of our organization, and he left his mark on many of the things we do and see at every chapter event.

Hugh served as Vice President in the early 80's, and worked as an active member of the Board of Directors for many years. In 1982, using his own money to fund the project, Hugh ran the first Chapter 44 group trip to Oshkosh using a Trailways Coach that took two days traveling each way. This was the beginning of the highly successful Oshkosh Airlift which has grown to be a mainstay of EAA 44's history.

During his many years as Newsletter Editor, Hugh transformed our monthly mailing from a simple "monthly mimeo" to the attractive, informative 8 page publication it has grown into. In addition to creating the newsletter, as a Xerox employee, Hugh regularly "tested" Xerox machines monthly, copying the newsletter and prepping it for mailing. In the mid 90's, Hugh was honored, winning the McKillop Award, EAA's annual recognition of

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

A few weeks ago marked the passing of a long time, lifetime member of Chapter 44 and friend, Hugh Jones. Hugh was one of those guys that for so many years served as an important staple for the organization. A member who was involved consistently in every aspect of the organization, one you could count on for anything all the time. Hugh served as Vice President in the early 80's around the same time I cut my teeth for the first time as president. I remember many a Board meeting at his house and the nice visits we had with his wife June and daughters. He served on and off the Board for many years.

In the email Norm sent out with the announcement of his passing, he reminded us that in 1982, using his own money to fund the project, Hugh ran the first Chapter 44 group trip to Oshkosh using a Trailways Coach that took two days traveling each way. I remember this trip and I believe our halfway point overnight was either Kalamazoo or Battle Creek. I just recall a lot of cereal factories in that area. Of course this was the beginning of the Oshkosh Airlift which means that our chapter has been making it to the annual "mecca" of aviation in this formally organized way for almost thirty years. Wow!

Hugh changed the face of our newsletter in revolutionary style and with the precision he was known for. This eventually led to Hugh being honored in the mid '90s by winning the McKillop Award, EAA's annual recognition of the best newsletters published by over 1000 chapters worldwide.

Hugh put his love of graphic arts to work for the chapter in many ways over the years and his footprint is just about everywhere including our first logo design.

At one time Hugh's sights were set on building the Coot Amphibian, and very popular design by Molt Taylor back in the 70's and 80's. At his funeral, his daughter reminded us of the story of him bringing back the fuselage boom on the bus trip from Oshkosh. I had forgotten that until she reminded us.

When he retired from Xerox, Hugh pursued his love of graphic arts. Always eager to help, Hugh created many of the publications and forms we still use. Perhaps his crowning achievement was the creation of our Chapter Logo, the stylized "44" followed by the wings in flight.

As a homebuilder, Hugh built the hull and fuselage of a Coot Amphibian, and very popular design by Molt Taylor back in the 70's and 80's. He was also active in the model aircraft scene in Rochester.

Hugh was a great chapter member, always eager to help and encourage new members to get involved. Whenever they needed a little extra help, he was there to encourage and provide suggestions and ideas. He will be missed.

He also mentioned to me that he was inspired by the Bay Bridge that he drove over everyday and dreamed about flying his Coot off that very spot of the Bay which kept his dream alive. I come from the west side of town and didn't get exactly what he was talking about until years later when I got a job in Webster and saw the same beautiful site he saw and a warm feeling came over me knowing Hugh and I got were part of the same brotherhood.

Hugh Jones was a member of the chapter when I joined. We soon had a number of things in common; WWII vets, love of airplanes real and model. Our daughters married brothers, so we were some kind of in-laws. We were co-editors of the newsletter for a while and when I became editor he was the mentor that I needed. There was no better craftsman. I would sketch things on an envelope and he would prepare computer drawings. I was in the "looks about right" category. Hugh couldn't live with that. When he and I decided to paint our chapter logo and numbers on the chapter house roof I was ready to snap two lines to be sure that the figures were of the same height. Hugh came with detailed dimension for each letter. I was ready to paint with a four-inch brush. Who could tell the difference from 500 feet on final approach? It took us twice as long but they looked great. Hugh also organized the library and had installed a computer for the index. He built the elevator of my miniMAX and where the plans called for the hinges to be mounted on top, he set them in flush. He served the chapter well and his death leaves a big void. Goodbye Friend.

My mother saved all the letters that I wrote while in the service. One written from boot camp tells about going to the small stores to buy clothing. "I think things are pretty expensive. They want 35 cents for a pair of shorts. T-shirts cost 30 cents. I always thought service men were to get things cheap." Remember we only made \$50 a month.

General Aviation News, May 25, tells about a healthy energy boost for pilots. It is called PILOT CHEWS. According to the author they work for about four hours, taste good and are less expensive than energy drinks. They help with "alertness, mental sharpness, memory, reflex, night vision and oxygen absorption." Anyone out there aware of this product? I better take some before I finish this.

My thanks to Phil & Marcia Hazen for picking me and other old goats up for the chapter meetings. Night driving can be a problem for us. Steve North has also filled in on this mission. We appreciate it!


