EAA PARTNERS WITH FAA, DYNON FOR STC BREAKTHROUGH TO UPGRADE SAFETY, REDUCE COSTS FOR AIRCRAFT OWNERS

EAA, in partnership with Dynon Avionics and the FAA, has been awarded a Supplemental Type Certificate (STC) to install Dynon's EFIS-D10A in certain standard category aircraft. This breakthrough STC enables the inexpensive, but very capable, avionics that have served the experimental and light-sport worlds for decades to finally have a pathway into the type-certificated market. The Dynon system is a direct replacement for a vacuum-driven attitude indicator, and the STC currently applies to the Cessna 150, 152, and 172 series and the Piper PA-28 and PA-38 series. More aircraft are expected to be added soon.

EAA worked extensively with the FAA and Dynon to show compliance with regulations and develop a new certification pathway for safety-enhancing equipment. The long track record of the D10A product line and its conformity to a variety of industry standards helped it become the first device accepted by the FAA in this pioneering effort. In addition to Dynon's proven reliability, the unit delivers a wealth of information to the pilot and even has an integrated angle of attack feature (with the installation of an optional probe). EAA installed the D10A in its 1976 Cessna 172M and submitted to a series of flight tests with an FAA test pilot, which went flawlessly.



EAA intends to begin selling the STC as soon as possible, hopefully later this spring, at a nominal price point in line with its existing autofuel STC. In addition to the D10A, more products are actively being explored as EAA is willing to work with other manufacturers to bring down costs and reduce barriers to recreational flying. OLD GOAT RAMBLINGS

I never lose anything, I just can't always find it. But I did find an article on the Bugatti 100 aircraft (The Flyer, January 2016.) It was in the March 2016 issue of Aviation History.



In 1938 Ettore Bugatti began to design an airplane to compete in the 1939 Italian cup races. Mostly made of wood construction the Bugatti 100 features forward-swept wings, an automatic flap system, a v-shaped tailplane with mixed controls, retractible landing gear, and two 450 HP Bugatti 50B engines, internally mounted behind the pilot, geared to drive two counter-rotating propellers. It is expected to reach 500-550 MPH.

In June 1940 the Bugatti was hidden in a barn in France. Restored after the war (by whom?) it has been displayed since 1996 in the EAA Museum in Oshkosh.

The Bugatti 100 never did fly, but in 2011 engineers Scott Wilson and John Lawson reverse engineered the original to produce a replica. On October 17, 2015 the airplane flew a closed course around the airport in Tulsa OK. Old Goat, Out.

Trevor Ewell, a member of the Radio Control Club of Rochester (RCCR) spoke about his model B-17 that he flies. It has a 12' wingspan and weighs 50 lbs. It takes off at 35 mph, cruises at 85, dives at 110, and lands at 50. A WWII pilot built it and sold it to Trevor.



He also invited us to their annual spring fly-in which is happening the same weekend as our Tri-Motor event. Let's try to support their event across the street at the model flying field in Northampton Park and they will support ours. Trevor did ask us to fly south and east of their field when using Runway 10.

Trevor also talked about military application of drone technology, whether it be mosquito-size for DNA "sampling" to Predators capable of dropping 1,000 pound bombs.

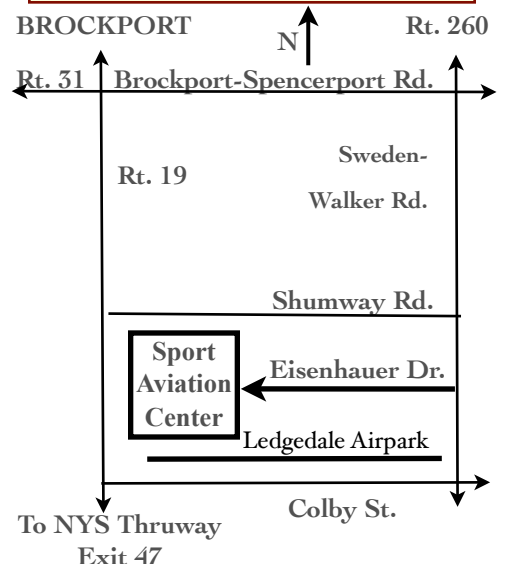
